## Data Changing Child Labour

Child labour is often seen as a subset of modern slavery or forced labour. There are an estimated 50 million people in modern slavery and 27.6 million in forced labour. However child labour actually sits alongside these groups, not within them.

3.2x as many children are in child labour than people in modern slavery



As of August 2nd 2023, in order to meet the SDG 8.7 target to eliminate child labour by 2025, we would need...

**181,406 children** leaving child labour

PER DAY

**7,559 children** leaving child labour

PER HOUR

**3 children** leaving child labour

PER SECOND

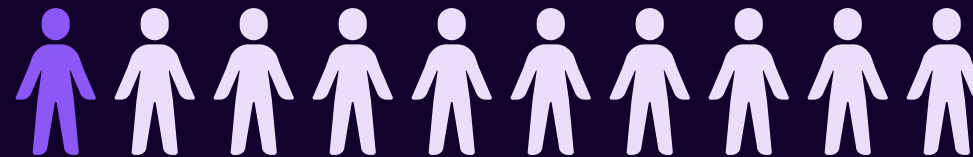
### 160 million children are engaged in child labour worldwide

#### 70% of all child labourers work in Agriculture

Agriculture sits at the bottom of most supply chains. This is where companies lack visibility, making them high risk areas for child labour.

#### The ILO's definition of child labour:

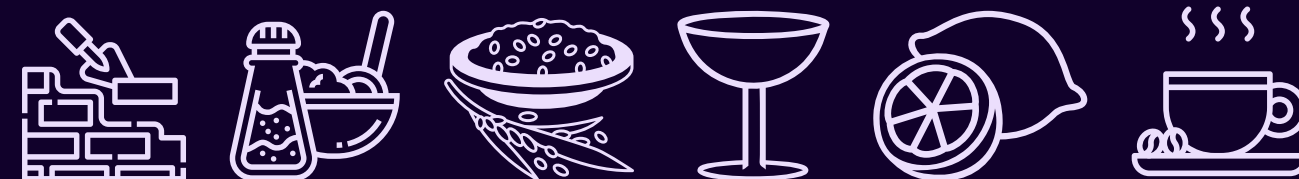
The term "child labour" is often defined as work that deprives children of their childhood, their potential and their dignity, and that is harmful to physical and mental development.



1 in 10 children are in child labour

In 2022, The US Department of Labor published a list of the goods produced by child labour. This list comprises 146 goods from over 70 countries.

These goods vary from bricks, salt, and glass to coffee, rice, and citrus fruits.
